Business Continuity Planning Workshops

Every workshop includes a basic checklist of mitigation and action prompts necessary to formulate contingency plans as necessary to ensure the continuity of the business while safeguarding their provision of services and their employee assets. There are two workshop versions available:

- The basic workshop has been designed for consumer/retail and manufacturing businesses
- The patient care version has been designed for healthcare facilities and healthcare providers with the obligation to provide care under all emergency scenarios.

Developed in 2002 for healthcare facilities as a simplistic approach to multi-hazard operational planning.
